

ITEMS THAT WILL BE ACCEPTED

Plastic Pop Containers – Rinse and remove lids

Plastic Milk Containers – Rinse and remove lids

Aluminum Beverage Containers – Rinse and empty

Glass Jars and Bottles – Rinse and remove lids, separate by color (clear, brown, green/blue)

Steel/Tin Can Food Containers – Rinse (lids okay)

Computer Paper – 11" x 14" green bar, blue bar, green/orange bar, white printout

White Office Paper – Typing paper, white copy paper, adding machine tape, white letterhead (no adhesives or plastic window envelopes)

Office Pack – Pastel shaded papers, carbonless forms, envelopes, opened direct mailings, coated papers, fax, file folders (paper clips and staples okay), no pressure sensitive labels

Shredded Office Paper – Sort the same as unshredded (please bag and label accordingly)

Newspaper – Inserts okay

Magazines, Catalogs, Brochures – Staples and glued bindings okay

Fiber material – 40" square x 36" high non-corrugated cardboard, construction paper, brown or tan clasp envelopes, tablet backing, paper board boxes like cereal, shoe, soap, paper back books, phone books, paper gift wrap (no foil), cardboard paper rolls, paper fiber egg cartons
